To Whom It May Concern:

Please be advised that the Public Utilities Commission of Nevada ("PUCN") has revised the application form for participation in the Portfolio Energy Credits ("PEC") trading program administered by the PUCN. The revised PEC application form reflects a revision date of January 2015 located in the lower right corner of the form. The PUCN updates the PEC application periodically to accommodate changes or additions to the information necessary to register a renewable energy system. Effective February 1, 2015 the PUCN will only accept FULLY COMPLETED PEC APPLICATIONS PREPARED ON THE FORM WITH THE MOST RECENT REVISION DATE. It is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that the most recent application form is submitted to the PUCN. Applications submitted on or after February 1, 2015 on an out of date form will be rejected. The PUCN posts the most current PEC application form on the following link:

http://puc.nv.gov/Renewable_Energy/RPS/PEC_Trading_Program/. I encourage you to bookmark the PEC application webpage and complete new applications directly from the PUCN website to ensure you are using the most up-to-date version of the form.

As a reminder, only renewable energy systems that are installed without the benefit of a utility incentive are allowed to participate in the PEC trading program. The law requires that all PECs for a system built with the benefit of an incentive provided pursuant to a renewable energy program ("Rebated System") become the property of the utility that administers the program. Any PEC application received for a Rebated System will be rejected. Submission of a PEC application for a Rebated System could be considered "offering false instrument for filing or record" under Nevada Revised Statute ("NRS") 239.330, and also as a violation of the PUCN rules and regulations, which, pursuant to NRS 703.380, could subject the system owner and/or party authorized to submit the PEC Application to potential fines or other administrative action.
